NEGATIVE DOUBLES

The only correct context for you to make a negative double is as follows*: Partner opens 1-of-a-suit and RHO overcalls another suit, up to some agreed maximum. Perhaps the most common, though not necessarily the best, such maximum is 3S. A negative double is not intended for penalty. Instead it most often shows 4+ (4 or more) cards in one unbid major. The only other suits that a negative double can promise are one unbid minor and, in one special auction only, both unbid majors. These three possibilities are amplified in the examples below. If you would like to *penalize* an overcall in your agreed range for negative doubles, you can only pass and hope partner "reopens" with a double. (Partner should do so when short in overcaller's suit and when the overcall level is not too high.) Minimum HCP requirements for negative doubles are roughly 6, 8, and 10, respectively, for 1-, 2-, and 3-level overcalls. However other considerations can increase or decrease these requirements: your length in partner's suit, length in the unbid suits, shortness in overcaller's suit, and the quality and location of your points. No *maximum* limit on your strength is ever implied by a negative double. The symbol X in the examples below denotes your negative double.

*An example of a different context is the following auction beginning with LHO, where your partner *overcalls* rather than opens: 1C, 1H, 2C. The opponents have bid and raised clubs, so you will rarely want to double 2C for penalty. Therefore, by partnership agreement, you can use a double to show both unbid suits, namely spades and diamonds. Example hands here are Axxxx-xx-KJxxx-x and Axxxx-xx-KQJx-xx. However, if you wish to give conventions their correct names, be aware that such an agreement is not classified under negative doubles, but rather under "responsive doubles." As stated above, a true negative double promises two suits only after 1C, 1D. Requiring two suits more generally would force you to pass far too often.

Attitudes Count !

The Board would like to remind our members again of the importance courtesy plays in the enjoyment of one of our most popular pastimes. We spend much of our precious time at bridge tables, and we want that time to be as pleasant as possible, in addition to being the wonderful intellectual challenge that it is. Luckily, the ACBL has provided us with rules. The rules stated below are taken from Chapter VII, Law 74 of the Laws of Duplicate Contract Bridge.

Proper Attitude

Courtesy

* A player should maintain a courteous attitude at all times.

Etiquette of Word and Action

A player should carefully avoid any remark or action that might cause annoyance or embarrassment to another player or might interfere with the enjoyment of the game

Conformity to Correct Procedure

Every player should follow uniform and correct procedure in calling and playing

Etiquette

As a matter of courtesy a player should refrain from:

- paying insufficient attention to the game
- making gratuitous comments during the auction and play
- * detaching a card before it is his/her turn to play
- prolonging play unnecessarily (as in playing on although he/she knows that all the tricks are surely his/hers) for the purpose of disconcerting an opponent
- summoning and addressing the Director in a manner discourteous to him/her or to other contestants

Violations of Procedure

The following are considered violations of procedure:

- using different designations for the same call
- indicating approval or disapproval of a call or play
- indicating the expectation or intention of winning or losing a trick that has not been completed
- commenting or acting during the auction or play so as to call attention to a significant occurrence, or to the number of tricks still required for success
- Iooking intently at any other player during the auction and play, or at another player's hand as for the purpose of seeing his cards or of observing the place from which he draws a card (but it is appropriate to act on information acquired by inadvertently seeing an opponent's card)
- showing an obvious lack of further interest in a deal (as by folding one's cards)
- * varying the normal tempo of bidding or play for the purpose of disconcerting an opponent
- k leaving the table needlessly before the round is called

Why not take this page with you to your next game and leave it on the table as a reminder for everyone.

The Smith Echo

Did you ever wonder about the phrase "Smith Echo" at the bottom of your convention card? It refers to a defensive signal that is easy to use and very low in cost. We explain with an example from *The Official Encyclopedia of Bridge*, Sixth Edition, page 431. Suppose your partner, West, leads a low spade against a 3NT contract. Your spade holding is Q J 5, and the four complete hands are

97-Q102-7654-AKQJ

A 10 8 4 2 - 9 8 7 - K 3 - 9 7 3

QJ5-KJ64-1098-1082

J 6 5 - A J 6 4 - 10 9 8 - 10 8 2

K 6 3 - A 5 3 - A Q J 2 - 6 5 4

You play the J, correctly fulfilling your "third hand high" obligation and playing "the lowest of equals." If the J were to hold, you would normally return a spade, namely the Q. However declarer wins the trick with the K. Partner then doesn't know who has the Q, and - here's the point - won't know whether to continue spades when regaining the lead. You will come to the rescue by giving a "delayed attitude signal" at the first opportunity. To be specific we go back to the play. After winning the K of spades declarer leads a club to dummy, planning a diamond finesse. Your club holding is 10 8 2, so you obviously cannot win the club trick and return a spade. Here is where you employ the "Smith echo": Rather than playing your 2 on the club trick, either just mechanically or to give count, you carefully choose the 10, *telling partner to continue spades when regaining the lead.* (If you use upside-down attitude signals you would play the 2 instead of the 10.) On the third trick declarer loses the diamond finesse to West's K. West then cashes 4 spade tricks for 1 down.

We now change the South and East hands very slightly and give you, East, the weaker spades J 6 5:

97-Q102-7654-AKQJ

A 10 8 4 2 - 9 8 7 - K 3 - 9 7 3

KQ3-K53-AQJ2-654

Again your J loses to declarer's K (good play!). On the club trick this time you play the 2, *telling partner not to continue spades when regaining the lead.* Again West gets in with the K of diamonds, but now exits with a heart. You grab the trick, return the spade 6, and the contract goes down 2.

General conditions for the Smith echo: Suppose your "third hand" play does not reveal your "attitude" toward partner's opening lead. (Either you played third hand high or partner led high and your attitude signal was not definitive.) Suppose also that declarer wins the first trick and breaks a new suit. Assuming you cannot win the second trick you play a Smith echo to tell partner whether the original suit should be continued from partner's side of the table.

If East's spades were quite weak, say 6 5 4, there would be no need for the echo. In general the price you pay for the Smith echo is the use of a count signal. This price is too high if dummy hits with something like 9 7 - Q 10 2 - 7 6 - K Q J 10 3 2. If declarer plays low to the formidable club suit on the second trick, and West also plays low, it's only common sense that East should abandon the Smith echo and give count instead. West presumably has the club A and needs to know when to play it. The Smith echo is used more often against notrump than suit contracts, but it can be used against either.

Mini-McKenney & Ace of Club Standings Unit 115 (As of 10/01/2003)

In 1974 the ACBL Board of Directors voted to recognize the masterpoint achievements of all players. Thus arose the Mini-McKenney races. The winners at each level of achievement (Rookie, Junior Master, etc.) are recognized by the ACBL each year in the March issue of The Bridge Bulletin.

To recognize achievement at the Club level, in 1984 the Ace of Club competition was created. These club championships are recognized at the unit level and ACBL-wide. All points won at the club level are counted in this contest with the exception of those won in StaCs, progressive sectionals, NABC fund-raiser events, the North American open pairs, and the Grand National Teams.



The tournament was headed for numbers well beyond estimate, but then fell off badly over the last weekend and ended back on original estimate of 12,402.
