INVISIBLE CUEBIDS

Bridge players are usually prepared when partner opens 1-of-a-suit and RHO makes a 1-suited overcall. We have our negative doubles, our cuebids for "limit raise or better," and our jump raises for preemption. We are usually far less prepared after a 2-suited overcall. Instances of 2-suited overcalls are Michaels cuebid, the unusual 2NT, and the "top and bottom" cuebid. Invisible Cuebids provide a uniform scheme for dealing with all 2-suited overcalls. The word "invisible" is used because RHO's suits, the suits you cuebid, are not explicitly mentioned in the overcall. When there are two enemy suits to cuebid, you can describe your hand quite elaborately. You thereby exact a price from the opponents for their overcall. The Michaels cuebids 2H and 2S are


exceptional in that each names only one suit. You may not guess the second suit and then use it as a cuebid. We now define *Invisible Cuebids*. Our standing assumption in all that follows is that partner opens 1-of-a-suit and RHO makes a 2-suited overcall.

FIVE RULES FOR INVISIBLE CUEBIDS

- 1. The cheaper or the only available cuebid promises a "limit raise or better" of partner's suit.
- 2. An explicit raise of partner's suit signals less strength than a limit raise.
- 3. The more expensive cuebid (both suits named) shows 10+ points and 5+ cards in the fourth suit.
- 4. An explicit bid of the fourth suit (both suits named) denies 10+ points. Partner can pass!
- 5. A double promises 10+ points, the ability to penalize at least one enemy suit, and either a double or a bid if LHO's bid is followed by two passes. You will not let the opponents play undoubled.

In this case, you will not be allowed to compete in the NABC Master Race but will be in the race for those with 300-500 points.

INVISIBLE CUEBIDS – Review & Conclusion

As in the previous Newsletter our standing assumption is that partner opens 1-of-a-suit and RHO makes a 2-suited overcall. As an example suppose partner opens 1C and RHO bids 2C. By asking LHO or by looking at the opponents' convention card you determine that RHO has hearts and spades. (Be aware that a 2C bid by RHO is not alertable even if it shows unbid suits other than hearts and spades!) At your turn to bid you can make an *invisible cuebid*, in this case either 2H or 2S. The word "invisible" is used because RHO never mentioned either hearts or spades. The rules for invisible cuebids were given in the previous Newsletter and are restated below. In the example just discussed 2H is called the "cheaper" cuebid, 2S is the "more expensive" cuebid, and diamonds

is the "fourth suit." The main purpose here is to provide abundant examples of the use of *invisible cuebids*.

RULES FOR INVISIBLE CUEBIDS

- 1. The "cheaper" cuebid promises a "limit raise or better" of partner's suit.
- 2. An explicit raise of partner's suit therefore signals less strength than a limit raise.
- 3. The "more expensive" cuebid shows 10+ points and 5+ cards in the "fourth suit."
- 4. An explicit bid of the "fourth suit" therefore denies 10+ points. Partner can pass!
- 5. A double promises 10+ points, the ability to penalize at least one enemy suit, and either a double or a bid if LHO's bid is followed by two passes. You will not let the opponents play undoubled.

EXAMPLES

Partner opens 1C ... RHO bids 2C (Michaels) showing Hs & Ss Ax-xx-xxxx-AQxxx: Bid 2H (cheaper than 2S) to show your limit raise in Cs.

Zero Tolerance Policy

The ultimate purpose of the Z-T policy is to create a much more pleasant atmosphere to make the game of bridge more enjoyable for all. Behavior not tolerated:

- Badgering, rudeness, insinuations, intimidation, profanity, threats, or violence.
- Negative comments concerning opponents' or partner's play or bidding.
- Constant and gratuitous lessons and analyses at the table.
- Loud and disruptive arguing with a director's ruling.

The director should be called **immediately**. Law 74A specifically prohibits annoying behavior, embarrassing remarks, or any other conduct which might interfere with the enjoyment of the game. Law 91A gives the director the authority to assess disciplinary penalties. An immediate 1/4 board disciplinary penalty (3 IMP in team games) shall be assigned to all offenders. If both members of a partnership are guilty, the penalties are additive (1/4 board EACH = $\frac{1}{2}$ board!). A 2nd offense in the same event, the offender(s) shall be ejected from future competition in that event. An offender removed from an event shall be deemed to have not played in the event, no masterpoints will be awarded, and no refunds will be made. All previously-obtained results shall remain valid as to their effect upon other competitors. If found to have committed a serious offense and/or multiple offenses (3) during a tournament, a disciplinary committee may determine whether the offender(s) should be allowed to play in other events at the tournament and/or whether additional sanctions may be appropriate. Warnings are strongly discouraged. Offenders are to receive immediate penalties. Regardless of who may have initiated unacceptable behavior, ALL offenses are punishable. Retaliatory behavior is a punishable offense. Frivolous accusations will also be considered offenses under this policy.



As I said at our recent Board meeting, we are looking for at least a dozen people to fill Jerry's shoes and then we would be half way there. Please when you see Jerry in Saratoga, Parsippany, or any one of our Regionals, take the time to say Thank You. No one could deserve this more.

We're off to a good start, however, filling this position. We have elected Peter Kalat from Bedford, New York - the Westchester Unit as president of the District. Peter has a great deal of experience in bridge administration. He has been tournament chairman and president of Unit 188 and is currently still serving on the unit board as unit counsel. He has been on our District Board for more than ten years and has been our GNT Coordinator. We welcome his expertise and leadership abilities and look forward to a continuance of great events run by District 3.

District 3 is very pleased to be sponsoring a program in each of our seven units. Any teacher teaching a bridge course in a school - kindergarten through college- that can then organize the students to come to a bridge club or other set location at a set time, in addition to their lesson series, and play bridge with the other students or have a mini-lesson if not enough students participate, will receive \$75 for each after school - after lesson group. In addition, there will be funds for a light snack such as pizza and soda. Teachers must apply for this grant to their unit who will submit the plan to the district and, if approved, a check will be sent directly to the teacher. This program will be offered from September '06 through June '07. Hopefully, many teachers will want to keep their students interested in bridge and will make arrangements to use a club for this after school activity. It is a great opportunity to introduce young people to duplicate bridge. We are hoping that units will promote this program and that many teachers will avail themselves of this offer.

The ACBL Charity Foundation decided last year to give \$100,000 a year to each of five different districts who would then select up to five charities to donate this money to. District 3 has voted to split it's \$20,000 evenly between: Make A-Wish Foundation, New Jersey Chapter; Habitat For Humanity, New Jersey Chapter; Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation, Westchester Chapter; The United States Bridge Federation earmarked to send 2 Schools Teams to Thailand in August to participate in the World Schools Team Championships.

Hopefully, you will all participate in charity games run by your unit and other units to help keep the Charity Foundation healthy so that these distributions will be ongoing.

I hope that you will have all enjoyed the Saratoga Regional and have noted the unavoidable change in date for next year - April 28 - May 6. It should work out wonderfully - snow birds will be home and everyone can play on Sunday. Just don't forget to mark your calendar. And while you're marking, please remember to take your July 4th holiday with us in Parsippany...Loads of hospitality and good bridge. Then a little lull and you can spend the Fall Foliage season at our Danbury Regional October 16-23. Gold points galore are just out there for the taking....Same great room rates and only a short drive for most of you. Bridge remains my favorite activity. I hope it is the same for you!

COMBATING OPENING PREEMPTS

By Lou Brickman

When is a double of an opening preempt *takeout*, and when *penalty*? The answer for many players is that takeout doubles end at 4H, and penalty doubles begin at 4S. Players following this agreement can then use 4NT for takeout of 4S, thereby showing a powerful hand of clubs (Cs), diamonds (Ds), and hearts (Hs). However, there is no bid to signal a powerful *two*-suited hand. This is a flaw that is rectified in the method described below. It is the approach recommended by Michael Lawrence and other authorities, and it received a 68% expert consensus in Bridge World Standard 2001. The first rule of the recommended method is that *takeout* extends up to

4S. Penalizing 4S is then possible only when the doubler's partner chooses to pass. Interestingly, however, Lawrence asserts (*The Complete Book on Takeout Doubles, page 42, 1994*) that you will get more penalty doubles of 4S this way than by using the double "for business"! The second rule of the method provides a neat treatment of 2-suited hands. Details and examples are given in the final two paragraphs of this article.

THE RECOMMENDED METHOD

1. DOUBLE is *takeout* for opening preempts through 4S.

Example: Partner doubles 4S with 6-KQJ7-AKJ3-AKJ5. With 53-T6542-Q976-82 you bid 5H, and with JT92-642-987-543 you pass.

2. 4NT after a 4S-opening shows a 2-suited hand, at least 5/5, not necessarily the minors.

Example (Lawrence): Partner has 4-AQJ87-32-AKQT7 and you hold 7652-KT63-K96-J4. The partnership bidding after the opponent's 4S will be 4NT, 5D, 5H, P. Your 5D bid shows your wish to eliminate Cs as trump.

Note: 4NT after a 4H opening shows the minors.

BIDDING AFTER OPPONENT'S 4S AND PARTNER'S 4NT

- 1. Bid 5C if either red suit is shorter than your clubs; otherwise bid 5D.
- 2. Partner passes if you bid one of his two long suits; otherwise he bids a long suit "up the line."

EXAMPLES

- 1. With 2-4-3-4 bid 5C. Your Ds are shorter than your Cs. Partner will pass with Cs, and bid 5D with Ds and Hs. You will then happily correct to 5H (or even 6H if strong).
- 2. With 2-2-5-4 bid 5C. Hs are shorter than Cs. Partner will pass with Cs, and bid 5D otherwise. You will then pass (or bid 6D). Don't start with 5D; partner will bid 5H when holding Hs and Cs.
- 3. With 3-5-2-3 bid 5C. Partner probably has the minors, and will then pass. If, however, he bids 5D, you will correct to Hs and obtain an amazing 10-card fit.
- 4. With 4-4-3-2 bid 5D. You definitely prefer the red suits. Partner will pass with Ds, and bid 5H with Hs and Cs. You don't want to bid 5C and see partner pass.
- 5. With 3-3-4-3 bid 5D. Your preference is Ds, and you don't mind Hs. You will land in one of these suits, with Ds about twice as likely as Hs. If you start with 5C, you will most likely stay in Cs.
- 6. With 3-4-3-3 bid either 5C or 5D. You land in Hs only when partner has Hs and the opposite minor.

Zero Tolerance Policy

The ultimate purpose of the Z-T Policy is to create a more pleasant atmosphere at the games; to make the game of bridge enjoyable for all. Examples of commendable behavior:

- Being a good 'host' or 'guest' at the table
- Greeting others in a friendly manner
- Praising the bidding/play of the opponents
- Having two clearly completed convention cards readily available to the opponents (This one is a regulation, not just a nicety)

Odd/Even Signals

According to the ACBL General Convention Chart, a partnership may use odd/even or other forms of dual message signaling on each player's first discard only. Otherwise, signals must be either right side up or upside down. A player who deliberately violates this rule subjects his partnership to adjusted scores when the opponents are damaged through the use of an illegal agreement, procedural penalties even when there is no damage, and possibly more severe penalties.

Did you know?

Niskayuna Continuing Ed will offer "Let's Play Bridge" in January on Monday evenings. It is a great opportunity for non duplicate players to get some practice time.

SANDWICH PLAYS

You are leading from a broken holding such as one of the following:

In each case there is exactly one missing card between your 2nd and 3rd highest cards. We shall assume that **the missing card is on your right**, and we shall call it the "sandwiched" card. Our conclusion will then be that you should **lead the "top of the sandwich"** (your 2nd card). The simplest case, example below with K J 9, is when you are defending, the dummy is on your right, and dummy's highest card is the sandwiched card. Our recommended lead is then usually called a "surrounding play" [1, p.506]. In the example

you must lead the J. If declarer covers, partner wins the A and returns the suit. Your side wins 3 tricks in a row. If declarer doesn't cover your J, continuing with the K gives you the same result. If you lead the 9 instead of the J, declarer plays low. Partner must then play the A to prevent dummy's 10 from winning. But then declarer's Q becomes a stopper. Finally, if you lead the K, neither you nor partner can ever lead the suit again without promoting a trick for declarer.

Next suppose declarer has A Q x instead of Q x x, much worse for your side. A careful study will reveal the following. If you lead the 9 you lose 3 tricks in a row. Leading the J, however, limits declarer to 2 tricks. Leading the K *this time* works as well as leading the J.

You can sometimes succeed without "the bottom of the sandwich," for instance when leading from K J 8



toward dummy's 10. But then *partner* must have the bottom. For example leading the J in the layout

 $Q \times x$

accomplishes your goal of winning 3 tricks in a row.

We conclude with an example of a sandwich play for *declarer*, usually called a "backward finesse." Consider the diagram [1, p.32]

The normal attempt to take 3 tricks is to finesse the J. However an alternative play can be preferable for any of the following reasons:

- (1) You, the declarer, have reason to believe that LHO has the Q.
- (2) You must not allow LHO to get in. (You need an "avoidance play.")
- (3) You are "shooting" [1, p.419] for a top in a pair game or for a big swing in a team game.

You decide to lead the J. Just as when defending, you hope the 10 is the highest card on your right. LHO covers your J with the Q, you win dummy's A, and you lead back toward your 9. When this maneuver succeeds you will appear to be a genius.

BUFFETT CUP NEWSLETTER #6

Well deserved winners

The inaugural Warren Buffett Cup ended on Sept. 24th with the American team of bridge players clinching the trophy with an impressive late show of strength. Having been behind at one point by 13 championship points, they finished 23 points in the lead, having won all five of the final five rounds, two of them clean sweeps – a genuinely outstanding performance.

The elegant crystal glass trophy was presented to the American team captain Donna Compton at the end of a gala dinner attended by all the players, their supporting teams and scores of local and visiting guests, including Jose Damiani, the President of the World Bridge Federation. Amidst several hours of singing and speeches, an improvised duet by Giorgio Duboin and Jill Meyers stood out, underlining the camaraderie and good feeling between the two opposing teams.

Splendidly organised by the Contract Bridge Association of Ireland, and played for honour rather than money, the challenge match was deemed by everyone that I spoke to as a success. A return challenge match will now take place in Louisville, Kentucky in September 2008, timed once more to coincide with the Ryder Cup of golf, on which this new bridge event has been modeled.

The concept of a challenge match featuring 12 of the best players of both sides of the Atlantic seems to have caught the imagination of bridge enthusiasts around the world. The match was broadcast on Bridge Base Online with commentary in five different languages. Up to 3000 spectators at a time watched the battle unfold online, while the Buffett Cup website attracted an average of 20,000 hits a day. The event has since been written up in several bridge columns, including The Times of London and The Spectator.

Individual performances

The mantle of the most watched player went to Zia Mahmood, the flamboyant and always entertaining member of the US team, playing on this occasion with Roy Welland. The players with the best individual scores over the whole event were Bobby Levin and Steve Weinstein (for the USA) and Giorgio Duboin and Norberto Bocchi (for Europe).

By universal consent however, the most impressive individual performance was that of Paul Soloway, who completed more than 200 boards in four days, following a tiring transatlantic flight, just a week after coming out of hospital. While he looked a little grey on the first two days, and was observed more than once snatching a nap at the table, the veteran American completed the event with one of the best overall individual records.

While the undoubted stars of the opening team section of the challenge match were the Italian and Irish pairs, who remained unbeaten in all six of their matches, it was a different story in the concluding individual section of the event. Four of the American players won six of their 11 matches (each one played with a different partner) and one, Jill Meyers, won seven. None of the European players managed more than four wins in this section.

In the end it was their impressive performance in the individual event that carried the Americans to victory. Although all the players were required to play a common simple bidding system in the individual round, based on a strong No Trump and five card majors, the Europeans probably faced the bigger challenge in adapting. The Italians, for example, have rarely played this way, while the system has many features in common with Standard American.

This may explain why there were some strange looking bidding sequences in the final part of the match. It also underlines why, as in golf, head to head challenge matches at bridge are about judgment and temperament, as well as technical skill. Throw in the match-a-board scoring system, which introduces some fascinating tactical dynamics, and you have the makings of an exciting spectator event, which is what the Warren Buffett Cup is intended to be all about.

The challenge match concept

One of the things that the organising committee for the return match will be studying is whether it is possible to simplify the bidding systems even further, with a view to increasing the popular appeal of the challenge match format. Bob Hamman, one of the moving forces behind the competition, is keen to make the challenge match a means of attracting new interest in bridge. A head-to-head match, played with minimal systems and a much simpler scoring system, could be a powerful boost to the game.

One impressive feature of the event was the excellent atmosphere in which the matches were played. Few if any hard words were exchanged all week, either between the teams or within partnerships. The match was played without bidding screens or any of the other measures that were introduced in the 1970s to preserve the integrity of international tournaments. They were unnecessary here.

For all these reasons, the success of this inaugural competition bodes well for the future of the game. Paul Hackett and the Contract Bridge Association of Ireland deserve enormous credit for getting this new competition off to such an impressive start. Now it is up to the bridge world to capitalise and to take the challenge match idea on to new heights and a permanent place in the sporting calendar.
