OPENING 1-OF-A-SUIT LIGHT IN THIRD SEAT

POSSIBLE ADVANTAGES

- (a) LEAD DIRECTION: Your bid could help partner if, as often happens, LHO becomes declarer.
- (b) PREEMPTION: Your bid, especially if it is 1-of-a-major, will often thwart an intended opening bid by LHO.
- (c) BUYING THE CONTRACT: Your bid, especially 1-of-a-major, could uncover an 8^{+} -card fit, and you might make a part-score or a worthwhile sacrifice.

REOUIREMENTS

- (1) You have 9-11 high card points. (Open all 12-point hands in third seat.)
- (2) You expect at least one of the advantages (a)-(c) listed above.
- (3) Assuming the opponents pass, you and partner must reach a contract below 2NT.
- You can pass a 1NT response by partner if you have no singletons or voids. You can pass a suit bid if you expect a 7 card fit. If you cannot reach such contracts by passing, you and partner are allowed one more round to do so.

EXAMPLES OF THIRD SEAT OPENING DECISIONS

- Axx-xxx-KQJx-xxx: Open 1D for advantage (a). You will pass any bid by partner. In fact you should open 1D even with the hand Axx-xxx-KQJ-xxxx.
- AJx-xxxxx-xx-Axx: Open 1H for advantages (b) and (c). You will pass any bid by partner. (You can't pass 2-of-a-minor if you play 2-way reverse Drury, but then you're happy about partner's heart support.)
- Axxxx-AJxx-xxx-x: Open 1S. If partner bids 1NT you will rebid 2H. Partner will then take a 2-level preference. You expect a 7⁺-card fit.
- Q-QJxx-Qxx-Axxxx. Pass. If you open 1C you have no adequate call if partner1 responds 1S or 1NT.
- AKx-xxxx-Qxx-Qxx: Pass. Opening 1C is unlikely to confer any of the advantages (a)-(c). On defense you'd much prefer a spade lead to a club lead.
- KQJx-xxx-Axx-xxx: Open 1S even though you play 5-card majors!
- K-KJxxx-xxxx-KJx: Do not open 1H vulnerable. You cannot comfortably pass if partner bids 1S or 1NT, and rebidding 2C is too dangerous.
- KJxxx-Q-xxxx-KJx: Do not open 1S vulnerable. Partner might bid 1NT or 2H.
- Axx-xx-AQxxx-xxx: Open 1D. If partner responds 1H you will rebid 1NT.
- xxxxx-Ax-xxx-AQx: Open 1S. If partner bids 2H, promising 5 hearts, you will pass.
- Axxxx-Axxxx-x-xx: Open 1S nonvulnerable. Your shape and your 8 points are extraordinary.
