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## Vice President's Message

## **Change to Our Sunday Swiss Event**

No doubt most members noted the change to the Sunday Swiss event in the most recent February sectional. Because the change came without significant advance notice and the event was somewhat new to many who played that afternoon, the Board thought it would be beneficial to explain how the new stratiflighted format differs from our timehonored bracketed Swiss and the traditional stratified Swiss offered in nearly all regionals.

For quite some time, the Unit has sponsored bracketed Swiss teams on the Sundays of our sectionals. In bracketed Swiss, the total master points of each team are reported to the director, and depending on the number of teams entered, teams are assigned to play against other teams of comparable master point holdings. Teams play only other teams in the same bracket, competing for awards only in that bracket. Regardless of skill level, teams cannot volunteer to play in a higher bracket and compete for the higher awards. You are what you are. Perhaps more importantly, most teams ended up playing the same teams Sunday Swiss after Sunday Swiss after Sunday Swiss. Many members though a change was needed.

However, the Board did not want to hold a traditional Swiss team event where teams are flighted (A, B, or C) based either on the master points of the highest ranking team player or the average of all players on the team. Although this type of event allows for any team to play any other team at any time regardless of flight (teams are paired by the computer after each match based on similar victory point holdings), the Board wanted to sponsor something different.

What the Board decided was to hold a stratiflighted Swiss team event, a kind of hybrid of bracketed Swiss and flighted Swiss teams. In stratiflighted Swiss, teams are separated into two strata, with the upper strat divided into two flights, an A flight and an X flight. The lower strat was divided into flights B, C, and D (with the final number of flights in the lower strat based on the number of entered teams). Teams with 12,000 or more total master points were in flight A, teams with one or more players with 1500 or more master points were in flight X, while teams in the B/C/D flights had no player with 1500 or more master points. As in bracketed Swiss, each of the B/C/D flights were comprised of teams with similar point totals. In addition, the X flight was open to all B/C/D teams, allowing them to "play up" on request. In the play, any A-X team could play any other A-X team in the upper strat, with B/C/D teams playing any other B/C/D team in the lower strat. In the end, awards were given for placing in each flight. One might ask why a B/C/D team would volunteer to "play up", the reason is they not only compete for awards in the A flight, but also for awards in flight X. As an example, the February award for placing first in Flight X was higher than placing third in flight A. and significantly higher than the awards offered for flights B, C, or D.

The Board decided to continue with the new stratiflighted Swiss the Sunday of the April sectional. The Board hopes the opportunity to play against different teams is enjoyable, and the higher award levels available to flight X teams an incentive to compete.

#### THIS 'N THAT FROM YOUR DISTRICT DIRECTOR

I just arrived back from the Spring NABC in Reno. This tournament has always been our largest Spring NAC but this year it had just over 12, 150 tables.... almost 3000 smaller than in 2004. The ACBL budgeted for this smaller number but it is just possible that the difficulty in getting from the east coast and the fact that the hotel is "stuck" out of the city with no place to walk to and is a bit run down was the cause of the smaller attendance. However, those that came were treated to great hospitality, good playing conditions and reasonable room rates.

News from the Board meetings: "Triple Points" have been substantially reduced effective July 1. There will still be plenty of these bonanzas but less than now and the MP 's have been cut back to 70% of sectional rating. I brought up a non-agenda item that was making many club owners and players unhappy. Management had made the decision that they would no longer send analysis sheets to the clubs for games such as the ACBL-Wide Senior Pairs. When this was discussed, some of us were able to convince Management that the clubs were entitled to receive these analysis sheets for their players in the mail and not have to print them out themselves. Raising the age for Senior games was again brought up and defeated. I believe that for those tournaments that still run Senior Events 55 is a comfort

zone and raising the age would do nothing for us. The Board has created a new NABC Event – the Super Senior Pairs. This will be at the Fall NABC for those over 70 years of age. It will be a 4 session Pairs Event. If you are over 70 years of age, think about coming to Orlando this fall and trying to win a National Championship.

The Saratoga Springs Regional is just a few months away. We're hoping for record braking attendance with our new event - The Golden Opportunity Pairs which is on Friday, June 18<sup>th</sup>. This event is a Gold Point bonanza for those with 0-750 MP's. A chance to compete in a limited event and win Gold. At the Rye Regional, our first of these events, we had 91 tables. We don't expect that number but are hoping for 50 tables. This is a chance to compete without the hotshots in your field. Don't miss this "golden opportunity". And of course the rest of our schedule has plenty of KO's. Compact KO's and two Senior games at 10am. Great hospitality, playing conditions along with beautiful spring weather makes Saratoga Springs a super Regional in the District 3 calendar. We expect you all to be there!!!! See you then.

Against 5♣ doubled, West leads a Heart, ruffed by Declarer's Club Two. Over to the ♠A, Club finesse, cash the ♣A, back to Dummy's ♣T, Diamond finesse. 12 tricks! Was that a foolish Double or what?

**EXAMP762** It's always embarrassing when you double them and they make an overtrick. But East missed the chance for a delicious deception! When Declarer leads a trump from Dummy at Trick 3, East might casually play the King! Now look at the hand from Declarer's point of view. East "obviously" started with the singleton &K ... the bad news is that there is a trump loser to West's &J85 ... the good news is that by now playing low towards Dummy's &T (instead of cashing the &Q) Declarer can force a second entry to the board for the Diamond finesse.

So, Declarer tries the aforementioned, but Dummy's  $\bigstar$ T is taken by East's Jack! That play of the  $\bigstar$ K has swindled a trump trick for the defense. And it has also swindled Declarer out of an entry to the board. Now the Diamond finesse cannot be taken and it's down one instead of making with an overtrick!

East's falsecard was almost a free shot. East may not have foreseen the havoc it would wreak, he just needed to know that unless West had the singleton A his play would not cost, and that one way or another it might gain. As for South, he could have saved the day. He had ruffed the opening Heart lead with the trump nearest to his left thumb, and unfortunately for him that was the Two. If he had saved that valuable Two for later and splurged out with the Six or Seven, he would still have a trump entry to the board for the Diamond finesse. But who would think of that at Trick 1?
