President's Cup

The Unit has scheduled the 2011 President's Cup for Saturday May 21 at the Studio. This annual event is a single-session Swiss team game where each team is comprised of players with different masterpoint levels. This year, teams will include one team member with unlimited point totals, normally the captain, one player who is a life master with fewer than 750 points or non-life master at any masterpoint level, one player with fewer than 300 masterpoints, and one player with fewer than 200 masterpoints. Eligibility for any of the three limited player categories is based on 2010 year-end masterpoint totals.

Those that have played in the President's Cup in past years can testify this is a funfilled event, giving everyone a chance team up with players with whom they have never partnered and play against other teams with, essentially, the same skill levels. Whether you are a newcomer, intermediate, or advanced player, we encourage everyone to think about forming a team and joining in on the fun.

This year, the co-chairs of the event are Bob Valenti and Chuck Mantia. You can either get together with your bridge playing friends forming your own team, or you can sign up for the event, and we can arrange a team for you. Unit 115 History

The President's Cup as we know it today has changed a lot over the years. It was started by Mike DeJoseph, who was president in 1981 and 1982. He was very active for many years in our Unit. He set up the conditions of contest in 1984. The Unit was very active during that period. We had 5 geographic areas- Albany County., Schenectady County., Rensselaer, Greene, & Northern Columbia Counties, Fulton, Montgomery & Schoharie Counties, and Saratoga, Warren & Washington Counties. To make it simpler, he named them Albany. Schenectady, Troy, Glens Falls, Saratoga, and Johnstown. There were 5 squads, headed by a captain who was appointed by the president .Each area could have as many teams as possible. Each team had 5 members: Freshman-less than 20 MPs, Sophomore-less than 100 MPs. Junior-less than 300 MPs, Senior- no upper limit, and Graduate- over 1000 MPs.

There were qualifying rounds from January 1 to March 15. Those interested in representing their area must fill out a President's Cup Card, giving game averages, individual scores and the initials of the Director in charge. Contestants may play as often as they wish, but the four best game percentages will be the only means of final competition.

The final round was a one session event. There were five rounds of 36 boards each. There were 3 pages of the conditions, but you can get the idea.

By 1992, the President's Cup was simpler. It was a one day event. Each team would consist of 4 players: a Life Master, one with less than 300 MPs, one with less than 150MPs, and one with less than 20 MPs.

Over the years, the categories have changed drastically. It's now a team with one LM, one with less than 650, one with less than 300 and one with less than 100. It is still a fun format.
