#### The President's Cup

The Unit's fun event of the year, The President's Cup team game, will be held Saturday, **May 17** at the Studio.

As reported in the Newsletter for the January sectional, the Board decided to change how the teams will be made up. In the past, teams were made up of players representing four different masterpoint levels. This year, come with a partner, the total masterpoints of the partnership will be added together, and the field quartiled. Teams will then be selected by random draw, with partnerships from the top quartile teamed with a partnership from the fourth or partnerships from the second quartile teamed with one from the third.

How does this differ from a traditional pro-am team game held at clubs? At club pro-am team games, you play with the same partner for all the matches. At the President's Cup, you will play with your partner for only one of the four matches and with one of your teammates for the other three matches. Each player will play with all their teammates for at least one match, but will not be allowed to play with their "brung" partner more than once. It had become difficult to formulate teams under the old rules. We did our best to establish masterpoint levels for each of the four players based on the demographics of the Unit, but demographics can't predict who will play and we often ran into a shortage of players for one or two of the levels. The randomness of the draw is also seen by many as a fairer way to establish teams for what we bill as the Unit's fun event of the year.

So, come with a partner or come alone. We'll have people at the front desk who can pair you with a compatible player. Then go out and enjoy the game.

#### THIS 'N THAT FROM YOUR DISTRICT DIRECTOR

As I am preparing for the Board meetings for ACBL in Dallas. I cannot help but remember that when we were in Phoenix last November, there were rather severe problems with the behavior of some of our players. #### Silver Point Special Game

Every Friday evening of our sectional, we run a special game oriented toward our C and lower B flight players. The game is called a Board a Match team game although it more closely resembles a standard pair event in its execution. The special part of this event lies in the masterpoint awards structure. It is possible for a lower level pair to get an award that is often in the four to six point range, all in desirable silver points.

Players come as a pair, register with the director and are randomly paired with a higher level pair as their teammates. The randomness insures there is no "stacked teams" as sometimes happens in other team events. You and your new teammates arrive at your home table and the director moves the E-W to a higher numbered table just like a pair event. Your N-S teammates will play the same boards as you do until all 24-27 boards are played.

The game continues until the end and then the game is scored via two different methods. The first is the regular pair event scoring, but the second method provides for team event scoring. In Board a Match scoring, each board is a win (1), loss (0), or tie (1/2). For 26 boards, average is 13.

This is the best of possible worlds as the lower pair with about a 50% game has a good chance for a substantial silver point awards. The format and movement is sometimes confusing to newer players, but the execution is fairly simple. Just listen to the director. (Note I recently played a Board a Match game at the Phoenix National and even experienced players had a hard time at the start.)

Nonetheless this type of game is a great opportunity for our C and B players as we offer very few opportunities for less experienced players to gain substantial silver points without directly competing head to head with A players. Come out and see at our upcoming sectional on FRIDAY nights. The next sectionals will be April 4<sup>th</sup> and July 18 in 2014.

4 is an iron-clad contract, and the play is simply a battle for overtricks. Not a big deal if you are playing rubber bridge, but in the world of duplicate bridge, overtricks are important. You are West, do something brilliant!

All the West players led the  $\forall K$  (nothing brilliant there), won by Dummy's Ace, after which it was a routine matter for Declarer to lose the Spade finesse. West cashed a Heart, and Declarer won the Diamond shift in her hand. Trumps were drawn, then came the A, the A and the A. When the A tumbled down, Declarer had 11 tricks.

The resulting -650 was the standard E-W score around the room, except at one table, where West did something wickedly clever. Yes, no doubt you spotted it right away, West ducked the  $\pm$ K on the first round of trumps! Of course, Declarer had no way of knowing that West now had the unprotected King, so she crossed to Dummy's  $\pm$ K and repeated the finesse. West won the King, cashed a Heart, and shifted to a Diamond and, although Declarer had made her contract, there were no overtricks and her score of +620 was worth zero matchpoints. That diabolical duck by West had persuaded Declarer to waste a valuable Dummy entry on a futile finesse.

However, West's play was not without risk, and he would hardly have been a hero if his Partner's trumps were, for example, Jx or JTx. But, if that had turned out to be the case, then at least he would have had an amusing story to tell on himself later. And he could no doubt count on Partner's legendary sense of humor as they ruefully scored - 680 and zero matchpoints.
