I know almost everybody wishes we were still in Saratoga Springs, but we won't be this year. Hopefully attendance will be up from last year.

At the sectional level, at our last Unit 115 board meeting we put together a committee to take a look at food costs. Since most people either go out for lunch or bring their own lunch, the committee decided to cut back on afternoon snacks and to put most of our funds toward morning and pre-lunch food. Hopefully this will work out for everybody. Of course we will still have pizza on Sunday. # THIS 'N THAT FROM YOUR DISTRICT DIRECTOR

As I'm sure you've heard by now, Hawaii was a great loss for the ACBL (over \$700,000), due to low attendance and related attrition costs. Attendance was some 2000 tables below estimates. In addition, the ill-fated Customer Relationship Management System resulted in a \$327,000 software write off and investment losses (a function of market declines since improved) were over \$200,000. Membership also declined by about 1.5%, and membership growth is the top priority for 2019, along with greater financial stability and more incentives to clubs and teachers.

On the positive side, Russ Jones, District 10 Director, was elected President and Joe Jones, former CFO, was appointed Executive Director. Joe already has achieved significant cost savings for the current year. In an effort to make NABCs financially viable, entry fees were increased to \$30 per session for NABC+ events, \$22 for other NABC events, and \$20 for regional events (NABC regionals not having been increased for the past ten years), while Intermediate/Novice fees remain unchanged at \$15 per session. An additional \$10 per pair will be charged in all events at the point screens are introduced, to reflect the cost of more than doubling the space needed and additional directors and security. All of these changes will take effect July 1, 2019.

On the bridge front, the Board decided NOT to eliminate the requirement to announce ALL no trump ranges, and it was decided that all individuals who have won a Grand Master qualifying event will be required to compete in the top flight or top bracket of any event, irrespective of master point levels or averages. Management and the Board will

continue to work on efforts to motivate players to stay at NABC host hotels.

District 3 regionals continue to suffer from declining attendance, partially result ing from a decline of over 500 members during the fall and winter months. Attendance at our Tarrytown Regional was about equal to last year, but still not enough to produce a positive return. With the return of our "snowbirds", we are hoping for higher attendance at our revamped Albany regional this coming June, where the hotel has provided significant concessions, including expanded free parking space in an excellent, well lighted and comfortable environment with easy access to restaurants and transportation.

Please do your best to support the District tournaments, by attendance and volunteer support where possible, and above all, bring in some new members! Best wishes to all for a healthy and happy 2019.

4♠ is an iron-clad contract, and the play is simply a battle for overtricks. Not a big deal if you are playing rubber bridge, but in the world of duplicate bridge, overtricks are important. You are West, do something brilliant!

All the West players led the ♥K (nothing brilliant there), won by Dummy's Ace, after which it was a routine matter for Declarer to lose the Spade finesse. West cashed a Heart, and Declarer won the Diamond shift in her hand. Trumps were drawn, then came the ♣K, the ♣A and the ♣J. When the ♣Q tumbled down, Declarer had 11 tricks.

The resulting -650 was the standard E-W score around the room, except at one table, where West did something wickedly clever. Yes, no doubt you spotted it right away, West ducked the ♠K on the first round of trumps! Of course, Declarer had no way of knowing that West now had the unprotected King, so she crossed to Dummy's ♠K and repeated the finesse. West won the King, cashed a Heart, and shifted to a Diamond and, although Declarer had made her contract, there were no overtricks and her score of +620 was worth zero matchpoints. That diabolical duck by West had persuaded Declarer to waste a valuable Dummy entry on a futile finesse.

However, West's play was not without risk, and he would hardly have been a hero if his Partner's trumps were, for example, Jx or JTx. But, if that had turned out to be the case, then at least he would have had an amusing story to tell on himself later. And he could no doubt count on Partner's legendary sense of humor as they ruefully scored - 680 and zero matchpoints.
